Carrier Notification Letter SN91081346, dated July 8, 1998, announced the implementation of a modification to the BellSouth acceptance and testing procedures for circuit delivery turn up. On May 7, 2001, the BellSouth Wireless Access Customer Advocacy Center (ACAC) implemented the previously published modification.

This policy requires BellSouth to successfully test its network to a device capable of looping the circuit. Upon successful completion of industry standard testing, BellSouth will notify the appropriate customer contact with your company, via telephone or email, and complete the service order.

BellSouth is excited about this policy and the immediate improvements that its customers will experience. Completion of the service order represents the end of the provisioning process. Any inquiry or trouble associated with that circuit will now receive maintenance priority that includes after hour and weekend dispatches, service restoration priority and out of service credits.
