Subject: IXCs, MPB, and CMRS CLECs - Billing Change for Duo County Telephone

Company in Kentucky

This is to advise of a billing change to non-common minutes of use being implemented in Kentucky between Duo County Telephone Company (EC/OCN 0401) and BellSouth.

Non-common minutes occur when each company bills from its recordings without the exchange of summary records between exchange companies. Primarily, the Initial Billing Company (IBC) is responsible for determining the jurisdiction, factoring, etc., for all usage (i.e., interstate, intrastate and local) and providing it to the Subsequent Billing Company (SBC) for billing to the customers. The Multiple Exchange Carrier Access Billing (MECAB) document, prepared by the Ordering and Billing Forum (OBF), establishes the guidelines for billing when multiple local exchange carriers are involved in providing service. The elimination of common minutes of use billing was approved at the OBF in November 2000 for implementation between companies beginning January 1, 2001, and ending August 31, 2002.

With minutes of use generated beginning August 9, 2001, the billing change to non-common minutes will be implemented. The last bill for BellSouth and Duo County Telephone Company for billing in a common minutes of use environment will be usage through August 8, 2001, and an IBC bill date of August 15, 2001.

Duo County Telephone Company should also be notifying its customers of this change.

All payments will continue to be made to the company rendering the access bill.
